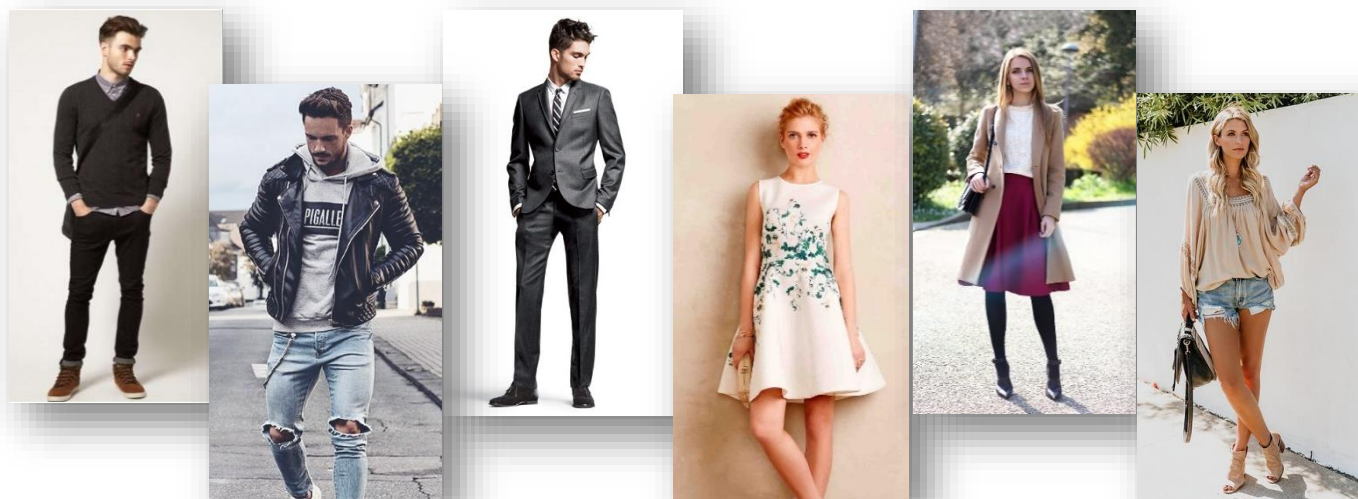
## Describe clothes and preferences
